

Equally comfortable picking pristine progressive bluegrass and electric jamband solos, Kyle Tuttle is a rare and virtuosic banjo player known for his work with GRAMMY-winning guitarist Molly Tuttle, and former Yonder Mountain String Band mandolin player Jeff Austin.

On his new record, *Labor of Lust*, Tuttle explores a wide range of sounds and possibilities for the banjo, while his songwriting gives insight into a tumultuous time in his own life; losing a mentor and going through a divorce. "A life in professional music, or performance of any kind really, is often painted in glamor... but the man behind the curtain can exist in a difficult duality. An attempt at putting a saddle on success can eat a person up and wreck the things they hold dear. In reality, any pursuit of the love of the masses can easily become a Labor of Lust."

Growing up in Georgia, Kyle Tuttle first began singing and playing folk songs with his grandparents. After studying at Berklee College of Music and moving to Nashville, TN, Tuttle played in the band of Yonder Mountain String Band mandolinist Jeff Austin until Austin's death in 2019.

No strangers to our Lovegrass Stage, Front Porch is highenergy bluegrass blended with an old-time mountain sound. Front Porch consists of Petey Wesley on banjo and fiddle, Alex Hawf on mandolin, John Henry on guitar, and Cameron Keeling on bass. Each member sings lead and harmony vocals, bringing a diverse style of authentic songwriting to their original music.

Front Porch independently released their first album "Shallow Grave" in the fall of 2023. Gaining attention across the midwest with their energetic live shows, their performances highlight their skillful instrumentation, where foot stomping clawhammer banjo, ripping mandolin, guitar and fiddle melodies are at the forefront of their driving sound.

Debutants is a high-energy string band with eclectic influences and a penchant to play anything they feel. Dancing between songs and styles of old and new, this fun-loving collective dazzles with impressive musicianship, earnest songwriting, and dynamic live performances.

Debutants have evolved from a duo between longtime friends, Lynn Nicholson and Jon Swain, into a formidable 7-piece string band with a string section. What always comes through loud and clear is the fun they're having playing together, and the vibrant life breathed into their music.

On their debut release, *Indiana Newgrass*, Debutants went into the studio with banjoist Michael Earl Newsome, fiddle player Sean Hoffman, and bassist/vocalist Colin Taylor. Also instrumental in capturing their sound, was engineer and producer Tyler Thompson at his Studio 110 in Pittsburgh, PA.

With the same lineup in 2023, the band tackled their first full-length album, River on the Moon. Nicholson and Swain were now joined by Hoffman and Taylor in songwriting. This release conveys their most ambitious and cohesive sound yet, in part due to recording all of it "live" circled together around a few microphones.

Looking ahead, 80 Proof Alice has exciting plans to launch a full studio album in 2025, promising even more captivating tunes for their growing fanbase.

# RULES, REGULATIONS & WHAT TO EXPECT

- A current motor vehicle permit is required for every motorized vehicle entering the state park. These can be purchased at the state park office or at the self pay station at the entrance to the state park. Your permit is required to be displayed for the duration of your stay and state park officials will be monitoring and ticketing those without permits.
- 2. The Lake Wilson Marina will have food and beverage items for sale, as well as arranged food trucks both at the marina, and on the festival grounds. Knotheads Baitshop just outside the state park also provides similar items. There are dining and grocery options in the nearby towns of Lucas, Wilson and Dorrance.
- 3. Our artists prohibit recording or use of professional cameras during the event.
- 4. This is a rain or shine event. Weather in Kansas can change at a moment's notice so please come prepared and make sure you keep informed of the weather conditions. IN THE EVENT OF SEVERE WEATHER FESTIVAL ATTENDEES WILL BE NOTIFIED.
- 5. Site staff, park officers and local law enforcement will be patrolling the area and can refuse entry to anyone.
- 6. Firearms, explosives or weapons of any type are not allowed on festival grounds.
- 7. The use, possession, sale or distribution of illegal controlled substances is strictly prohibited. Violation of this restriction, shall, at a minimum, be reason to refuse entry or expel an attendee from the festival site.
- 8. The use and possession of alcohol beverages is permitted at Wilson state park, so long as such possession and use is consistent with federal, state and local laws and regulations.
- 9. PATRONS WHO EXHIBIT EXTREME PUBLIC INTOXICATION, ARE INVOLVED IN PHYSICAL ALTERCATIONS OR EXHIBIT ABUSIVE BEHAVIOR WHICH CREATES A NUISANCE TO THE PUBLIC ARE SUBJECT TO IMMEDIATE REMOVAL FROM THE FESTIVAL GROUNDS WITHOUT WARNING.

- 10. Motor vehicles are restricted to maintained roads and parking areas only, unless otherwise posted, and are limited to a 25-mile-per-hour speed limit. Parking areas will be marked and you must not obstruct the flow of traffic and be completely pulled off of roadways. Please drive slow and watch for pedestrians, bicyclists and children playing.
- 11. Camping is allowed only in designated areas and is subject to restrictions as posted. No Saving of camping areas is permitted in the Lovegrass premier camping areas. Property left unused or unoccupied for 48 hours is subject to removal.
- 12. ONE vehicle per camping permit (Primitive OR Electric) is allowed in camping areas (Buffalograss, Big Bluestem, Dakota). <u>Additional vehicle permits can be purchased at the</u> <u>ticket registration link</u>.

- 13. Fires are allowed in fireplaces, fire rings, and cooking grills. Fires must be extinguished prior to leaving the area.
- 14. Swimming is allowed in designated areas. Liquor and beer are prohibited on swimming beaches or in waters designated by buoys or other markers as swimming areas. Only shatterproof containers are allowed. No Lifeguards are on duty, SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK.
- 15. Boating and fishing regulations can be obtained at Wildlife and Parks offices or the <u>KDWP website</u>.
- 16. NO PETS are allowed on the Lovegrass Festival grounds. In other areas, the state park allows pets, but they must always be restrained by a camper, cage, hand-held leash, or tethered chain no longer than 10 feet. They are not allowed on swimming beaches or swimming areas that are delineated by buoys or other markers or in public buildings or structures. Dogs participating in authorized activities or assisting the visually or hearing impaired are not subject to these restrictions.
- 17. Fishing is prohibited on boat ramps, swimming beaches, and in swimming areas marked with buoys. In state parks, fish may only be cleaned at designated fish cleaning stations or other locations as posted.
- 18. Boats may not be operated within 200 feet of any area posted specifically for swimming and delineated by markers. No-wake speeds are required within 200 feet of a boat ramp, boat dock, boat storage, or concessionaires facilities. Boats

may be moored or stored in excess of 24 hours only at designated sites. Vessels left unattended at other than a designated moorage or storage sites are subject to removal. Other posted notices may apply.

- 19. Fireworks are not allowed at any time during the festival.
- 20. PACK IT IN PACK IT OUT! Litter must be put in trash containers, if provided. Where containers are not provided, park users must carry their trash out with them. Recycling containers will be provided on site. Please keep our park even cleaner than you found it!
- 21. Digging holes, removing geological formations, archaeological relics or ruins, or vegetation (except for noncommercial use of edible wild plants, wild fruits, nuts, or fungi) is prohibited.
